ABOUT THE YARRA MAGPIES ACADEMY



The YJFL's Representative Program

YJFL and Collingwood NGA has combined to form the Yarra Magpies Academy (YMA). The Yarra Magpies Academy program is designed to identify and develop talented young footballers from the YJFL. The program aims to provide players with opportunities to improve their skills, develop their game sense, and prepare them for the rigours of elite level football.

Eligible players will be selected and elevated to Interleague teams to represent their league in the annual AFL Victoria Metro Development Series, Interleague, NGA games or representative matches.



In the past, the YJFL has compiled representative squads with the primary goal of competing against other leagues either by arrangement (Under 13), or through the AFL Victoria's Junior Metro Development Series for Under 14 and Under 15 aged boys and girls.

The major change is the program's purpose. Whilst between under 13 and Under 15 there will still be games played to pit the best players against other leagues and intra-league games, the primary focus will be on progressive AFL skill and personal development under a defined curriculum

that starts at under 13 and progresses through to Under 15, focusing on the skill execution expected for entry into the Under 19 NAB League competition. This means that all players in the program, regardless if they make the YJFL team, will get ongoing skills development, putting them in the best position for AFL selection at an older age. There are countless players, picked up on AFL or AFLW draft night, that did not make junior representative squads. This new program method ensures ongoing development for all in the program

The partnership joins Collingwood NGA coaches and YJFL coaches under the one Yarra Magpies Academy banner so players will have access to best in class coaching.

Players aligned (by residential geography) with other Elite U19 comp regions (eg Northern Knights or Eastern Ranges) should align with the league talent pathway (in YJFL's case the Yarra Magpies Academy) until Under 15 and align under geography at Under 16 into the U19 Comp Talent region.



Principles of the Yarra Magpies Academy

- The Yarra Magpies Academy (YMA) will aim to provide the best model for football skill development
- 2. Align with the AFL strategy for involvement of AFL clubs in the pathway
- 3. Develop MI and Talent in preparation for entry into the under 17 level of the Under 19 Elite junior pathway
- 4. Boys and Girls developed to execute fundamental football skills at a high level
- 5. Where possible collaborate with Under 19 Elite Competition club programs to ensure smooth transition to U16s.







AFL VICTORIA METRO JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT SERIES



The AFL Victoria Metro Development Series is an inter-league competition that sees more than 1200 of the most talented under 14 and 15 boys and girls from Melbourne's metropolitan community football leagues compete against each other.

The series gives community leagues the opportunity to pick players whose performance at local club level has warranted selection to participate in the interleague competition, as part of the talent pathway to higher-level programs for boys and girls, such as the Coates Talent League.

This highly competitive event will see the best young talent from Yarra Magpies Under 14 and Under 15 boys and girls program compete against other representative teams from the Eastern Football Netball League, Essendon District Football League, Northern Football Netball League, Riddell District Football Netball League, South Metro Junior Football League and Western Region Football League.

The competition commences with night matches taking place on Wednesday, May 31, before continuing on the King's Birthday long weekend with games to be played on Saturday, June 10 and Monday, June 12.

The competition has expanded to now include an Under 14 Girls division, with a total of 69 matches to be played across the three match days in the following seven divisions:

- U15 Boys Division 1 and 2
- U15 Girls Division 1 and 2
- U14 Boys Division 1 and 2
- U14 Girls Division

25 different venues will host matches across the series, including Ford Park, Bellfield, RSEA Park in Moorabbin and Avalon Airport Oval in Werribee. The YJFL will host home games at Ford Park, Bellfield, and Binnak Park, Watsonia.



Our digital partner, Gameface, will stream all YJFL home games with commentary.

U14 GIRLS PROGRAM

LUKE PARAMANATHAN

Head Coach



One of the most exciting things I've experienced this year is seeing the amount of new talent we have added to this program.

We brought in over 20 new players, who have lifted our standards on and off field to a level I never thought we'd reach so soon. I was lucky enough to coach majority of the group last year, so it made this years transition to the standards/ expectations we want a lot easier. Our returning players knew what I and the other coaches wanted, and they guided and supported the new players.

For the first time, the players had the chance to run through the combine testing. This was daunting for a lot of them, as they worried about their performance and how it would stack up against others, but I reinforced to them that this is a useful tool that can help guide them on their strengths and areas to improve upon, especially in comparison to their role on game day.

Our big focus this year as been embracing the motto "Side Before Self", with the players taking ownership of it by coming up with the main actions & behaviours they can do in order to express this. Some of the actions they've talked about doing is as simple as hi-fiving a team-mate as you go past, to picking up a team-mate after they've gone to ground in a tackle.

In addition, I've continued my focus from last year on fundamental skills, space (when to go into a contest and when to hold back), switch kicks and playing a game style that reinforces our weapons (and has elements that link to elite level systems). My goal as a coach, is to give every single player the experience of an elite

level program and to give them the guidance and support to allow them to have the best football careers. Whether that's in the AFLW, VFLW, Coates Talent League or local club, I want each of them to come from our program being better players and better people.

Key matchups:

Having 3 matches this year will be so good for the players, as it gives them a number of games to not only get used to the higher standard of these games, but more opportunity to implement everything we've taught them and show off their weapons. I'm most excited about our first matches, as these games are not only away in Maribyrnong and Cheltenham (which is far for a lot of our team) but we also have the chance to play at night, which is a first for a lot of these players.



Key outcomes:


The goals for these teams is to play with freedom in the parameters of the game plan in a way that showcases the players' strengths.




